the arch decorated with death of the stag, the
spandrels decorated with figures emblematic of
the seasons, the twin train four pillar movement
striking on a bell, contained within broken scroll
hood, supported by turned columns, the trunk
with bow-shaped door flanked by half columns
on a rectangular panelled base, weights,
pendulum and winding key present, 220cm high.
